Pre-installation Questions and Answers

About curing of the paint

Your stove or fireplace has been painted with the highest quality silicone stove paint. This paint dries quickly in 15-20 minutes when first applied at the factory. However, due to the high temperature silicone components, the paint will cure when heat is applied to the appliance as it is first used. The following information applies to the curing process to get the paint fully hard and durable.

Fire the appliance four successive times for 10 minutes each firing and a 5 minute cool down between each.

- Babies, small children, pregnant women and pets should leave the area during the cure phase.
- Do not touch during curing.

-Operating Instructions-

- Be sure to read and understand all the instructions in this manual before operation of appliance.
- 2. Ensure all wiring is correct and properly enclosed to prevent possible shock.
- 3. Check for gas leaks.
- 4. If the unit is turned off, you must wait a minimum of 60 seconds before relighting it.

Why does my fireplace or stove give off odor?

It is normal for your fireplace to give off some odor at first. This is due to the curing of the paint, adhesives, silicones and any undetected oil from the manufacturing process as well as the finishing materials used with the installations (e.g. marble, tile and the adhesives used to adhere this product to the walls can react with heat and cause odors).

These odors can last upward to 40 hours of burn time.

Noise coming from the fireplace?

Noise is caused by the expansion and contraction of metal as the appliance heats up and cools down. This is normal and is similar to the sounds produced by a furnace or heating duct. This noise does not affect the operation or longevity of your fireplace.

Note to the Installer:

Be sure appliance is working properly and its operation (including remote control operation, if included) is fully explained to and understood by the customer.

Important Information About Outdoor Fireplaces

Before you build in this appliance:

- Do not insulate around the appliance. Heat buildup could lead to component failure.
- Pay attention to all clearances to combustibles and specifications stated in this manual.
- Drainage- If this appliance is installed in a location where it will be exposed to water and moisture, drainage is an important consideration.
- Inadequate drainage will cause rust, which is not covered by the warranty.

Information about outdoor fireplaces

- Outdoor fire burning appliances may not function properly at all times regardless of the circumstances.
- Wind can greatly affect flame performance. If used in windy conditions a wind guard is recommended.
- Outdoor units require adequate ventilation in order to burn properly.
- Restricted access to air is not only dangerous for persons near the appliance, but the appliance also will not function correctly.
- This appliance consumes air, burns fuel, and emits heat and exhaust gases.
- Only approved media and accessories listed in this manual should be used with this appliance.
- This appliance is not intended for use in temperatures below freezing.
- The pilot burner (if equipped) should be OFF, and covered to protect it from the elements when not in use.

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Warnings, Installations and Operations



FOR SAFE INSTALLATION AND OPERATION OF YOUR GAS FIREPLACE PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

- when an appliance is for connection to a fixed piping system, the installation must conform with local codes or, in the absence of local codes, with the National Fuel Gas Code, ANSI Z223.1 • NFPA 54; National Fuel Gas Code; Natural Gas and Propane Installation Code, CSA B149.1; or Propane Storage and Handling Code, CSA B149.2, as applicable.
- 2. THIS UNIT IS NOT FOR USE WITH SOLID FUEL.
- 3. Always keep the appliance clear and free from combustible materials, gasoline, and other flammable vapors and liquids.
- 4. Inspect the fuel supply connection (including the hose for LP models) before each use of the appliance. See Lighting Instructions for removal of Access Panel.
- 5. If it is evident there is excessive abrasion or wear, or the hose is damaged, it must be replaced prior to the appliance being put into operation. Locate the hose out of pathways where people may trip over it or in areas where the hose may be subject to accidental damage
- 6. Locate the hose out of pathways where people may trip over it or in areas where the hose may be subject to accidental damage.
- 7. Children and adults should be alerted to the hazards of the high surface temperatures of this appliance and should stay away to avoid burns or ignition of clothing.
- 8. Young children should be carefully supervised when they are in the area of the appliance.
- 9. Clothing or other flammable material should not be placed on or near the appliance. This appliance should not be used as a drying rack for clothing.
- 10. Any safety screen or guard removed for servicing an appliance must be replaced prior to operating the appliance.
- 11. Installation and repair should be done by a qualified service person. The appliance should be inspected before use and at least annually by a professional service person. More frequent cleaning may be required due to excessive lint from carpeting, et cetera. It is imperative that control compartments, burners and circulating air passageways of the appliance be kept clean.
- 12. Do not use this appliance if any part has been under water. Immediately call a qualified service technician to inspect the unit and to replace any part of the control system and any gas control which has been underwater.

LP Cylinder Requirements

The LP gas supply cylinder used with LP models must be constructed and marked in accordance with the specifications for LP-gas cylinders of the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) *Specifications for LP-Gas Cylinders, or the Standard for Cylinders, Spheres and Tubes for Transportation of Dangerous Goods and Commission*, CAN/CSA-B339, as applicable.

- The LP gas supply cylinder used with LP models must be provided with a listed overfilling prevention device.
- The pressure regulator and hose assembly supplied with LP models (PN# 27FP-900FF) must be used.
- Replacement pressure regulators and hose assemblies must be those specified in this manual.
- Always check for gas leaks with a soap and water solution. DO NOT USE OPEN FLAME FOR LEAK TESTING.
- When an LP model is not in use, the LP-gas must be turned off at the supply cylinder.
- At altitudes above 4500ft appliances should be derated 4% every 1000ft. However, check with local gas supplier as fuel supply may already be adjusted.
- Refer to Assembly and Installation for leak testing procedures.
- Refer to Gas Specifications for gas inlet pressures.
- Refer to Gas Specifications for input rates.
- Refer to Lighting Instructions for normal sequence of the ignition system.

Locating Your Appliance


Note: Ventilation and air flow comes from openings in the walls and ceiling. Open floor space around the appliance must not be considered ventilation and air flow space.

- This unit requires combustion air and will produce exhaust gases. Install in an open-air situation with natural ventilation and without stagnant areas.
- Avoid installing in tight spaces and corners.
- Be aware of combustibles (i.e. furniture) near appliance.
- By definition, an outdoor space is not enclosed. Any area in which these appliances are used shall comply with the structures shown below.


Locating Your Appliance – Outdoor Spaces

This appliance may be installed within the following structures:

1.




Walls on all sides (Minimum area of 96 square feet), but with no overhead cover and at least one permanent opening (doorway) at ground level.




Within a partial enclosure that includes an overhead cover and no more than two side walls.

These side walls may be parallel, as in a breezeway, or at right angles to each other.



Within a partial enclosure that includes an overhead cover and three side walls, as long as <u>30 percent</u> or more of the horizontal periphery of the enclosure is permanently open.

All models can be installed safely in a screened porch area within the following guidelines:

Minimum porch area is 96sq. feet with two sides fully open.

A minimum of two (2) walls can be screened, but must be open to outside ventilation, with a minimum screen area of 64 sq. feet, and a minimum side wall height of 7 feet from the top of the fire pit.

MARNING -RISK OF FIRE-


Installation Clearances

CLEARANCES FOR ROUND FIREPIT (FP2085T)

- 1. The round firepit (FP2085T) cannot be built into a combustible cabinet of any type. Only non-combustible materials may be placed around firepit. (eg., bricks, concrete, river rock, etc.)
- 2. Clearance to combustible side wall is 24" minimum. Non-combustible walls 14" to side wall.
- 3. Minimum clearance to any ceiling with no overhang is to be 7 feet from top of firepit.
- 4. Clearance to a combustible floor is 0".


CLEARANCES FOR RECTANGLE FIREPIT (FP2785T)

- 1. The rectangle firepit (FP2785T) may be built into a combustible enclosure. You must maintain minimum enclosure dimensions of 32-1/2" x 39-1/2" I.D. The top of enclosure must be of a non-combustible material such as concrete board or wonder board.
- Clearance to combustible side wall is 24" minimum. Non-combustible walls 14" to side wall.
- 3. Minimum clearance to any combustible ceiling with no overhang is to be 7 feet from top of firepit.
- 4. Clearance to a combustible floor is 0".



2785FPT - Installation in a Wooden Enclosure

- 1. Minimum size of wood enclosure must be no less than 32.5" I.D. x 39.5" I.D.
- Non-combustible material (e.g., Wonder Board) for the top of enclosure must be used, along with metal gussets.
- 3. Non-combustible materials such as tile or brick may be used to finish on top of Wonder Board. Do not use any combustible materials to finish top, e.g., wood or plastic products.
- 4. You must have an opening in the enclosure to have access to the on/off valve.
- 5. A minimum of [2] 1" x 4" air openings are required.




Installing Wall Clearance Shield

NON-COMBUSTIBLE CORNER CLEARANCE SHIELD

- 1. Using a non-combustible material (eg. Wonder Board) cut two shields, [1] Large 44" x 30 min. and [1] Small 37" x 30" min.
- Mount six 1" non-combustible spacers to wall, this will maintain a 1" air space behind shields Fig:1, Ref: F. Non-combustible spacer (e.g., Metal Bracket, Wonder Board) should be no wider than 1" and 30" long.
- Screw non-combustible shield to spacer. Shield must be placed 1" below top of firepit Fig: 2, Ref:D. Inside corners of shields should not touch combustible wall. Shield must extend 3" past end of firepit Fig:1, Ref: E.
- 4. Note: Firepit cabinet or other structures must NOT obstruct wall shield air space on ends, top or bottom. If a cabinet is built around firepit, the end face of cabinet must not extend past bottom face of clearance shield by more than 1/2" Fig:2, Ref:

SINGLE CLEARANCE SHIELD

- Side of unit must be more than 24" from a combustible wall for a single shield to be used, and can have a distance of no less than 14" to a wall shield.
- 2. All specifications as in corner installation must be used, including shield must extend a minimum of 3" past sides of firepit Fig:1, Ref: E.



FP2085T & FP2785T - Assembly and Installation

The log set (LOGC85) and the burner assembly are shipped separately.

- A. Remove the gas log set and burner assembly and check for damage. DO NOT install damaged components. The logs are fragile use care when handling.
- **B.** Place the burner assembly on a flat, stable surface in an outdoor location such as a patio or a deck. This location must be adjacent to the gas supply line (natural gas) or LP-gas supply cylinder.

NOTE: Minimum clearances to combustible construction must be maintained. Remember, you must have easy access to the gas valve control knob AFTER the appliance is installed and connected to the gas supply.

THE ON/OFF GAS VALVE IS USED TO TURN THE BURNER ON AND OFF.

C. NATURAL GAS MODELS: Connect the incoming gas supply line to the on/off gas valve of the appliance (Figure 1). Make certain ALL gas connections are tight, turn the on/off valve at the unit slowly to the on position and use soap water to test for leaks. DO NOT USE AN OPEN FLAME.

LP-GAS MODELS:

PROPANE CYLINDER WITH TYPE 1 FITTING

- Make sure tank valve is in its full off position. (Turn clockwise to stop).
- Check tank valve features to ensure it has proper external mating threads (Tank Valve Marked: USE WITH TYPE 1).

- 4. After inspecting the LP hose shipped with the unit, connect the end with the female fitting on the hose to the male fitting on the on/off gas valve at the end of the flex tube and make sure it is tight.
 NOTE: Fuel Supply line must not come into contact with surfaces having temperatures in excess of 140°F. LP gas cylinder must be kept a minimum of 4.5 feet from the appliance. You must use an approved LP cylinder retention device (See Gas Specifications for an example).
- When connecting regulator assembly to the tank valve, hand tighten nut clockwise to a positive stop. DO NOT use a wrench to tighten. Use of a wrench may damage quick closing coupling nut and result in a hazardous condition.
- 6. Locate the hose out of pathways where people may trip over it or in areas where the hose may be subject to accidental damage.
- 7. Open tank valve fully (counter-clockwise). Turn the on/off valve at the unit slowly to the on position and use a soapy water solution to check all connections for leaks before attempting to light the appliance. If a leak is found, turn tank valve off and do not use the appliance until repairs can be made by a local LP Gas Dealer. DO NOT attempt to make repairs yourself.
- 8. Never attempt to use this appliance or any components that have been damaged or exposed to an accidental fire.





Enclosures for LP (Propane) Gas Supply Systems




If you build an enclosure for an LP gas cylinder you must follow these specifications. You must also follow local codes.

An enclosure for an LP-gas cylinder shall be ventilated by openings at both the upper and lower levels of the enclosure. This shall be accompanied by one of the following:

- a. One side of the enclosure shall be completely open; or
- b. For an enclosure having four sides, a top, and a bottom:
- At least two ventilation openings shall be provided in the sidewalls of the enclosure, located within 5 in (217 mm) of the top of the enclosure, equally sized, spaced at a minimum of 90 degrees (1.57 rad), and unobstructed. The opening(s) shall have a total free area of not less than 1square inch per pound (14.2 cm2Ckg) of stored fuel capacity.
- 2. Ventilation opening(s) shall be provided at floor level of the enclosure and shall have a total free area of not less than 1/2 square inches per pound (7.1 cm2Ckg) of stored fuel capacity. If ventilation openings at floor level are in a sidewall, there shall be at least two openings. The bottom of the openings shall be 1 in (25.4 mm) or less from the floor level and the upper edge no more than 5 in (127 mm) above the floor level. The openings shall be equally sized, spaced at a minimum of 90 degrees (1.57 rad), and unobstructed.
- 3. Every opening shall have minimum dimensions so as to permit the entrance of a 1/8 in (3.2 mm) diameter rod.
- Ventilation openings in sidewalls shall not communicate directly with other enclosures of the appliance.

The cylinder valve shall be readily accessible for hand operation. A door on the enclosure to gain access to the cylinder valves is acceptable, provided it is non-locking and can be opened without the use of tools. Designs



using a cover to gain access to the cylinder and cylinder valve shall be provided with handles or equivalent at a minimum of 180 degrees apart to facilitate lifting of the cover.

The enclosure for the LP-gas cylinder shall isolate the cylinder from the burner compartment to provide:

- a. Shielding from radiation;
- b. A flame barrier; and
- c. Protection from foreign material.

There shall be a minimum clearance of 2 in (50.8 mm) between the floor of the non-disposable LP-gas cylinder enclosure and the ground.

The design of the fireplace shall be such that:

- a. A non-disposable LP-gas cylinder can be connected, disconnected, and the connections inspected and tested outside the cylinder enclosure; and
- b. Those connections which could be disturbed when installing the cylinder in the enclosure can be leak tested inside the enclosure.

Be certain to mount or set the LP-gas cylinder on a flat stable surface and retain it to prevent it from tipping. Purge the gas supply line of any trapped air prior to the first firing of the unit.

WARNING: During the initial purging and subsequent lightings, NEVER allow gas valve to remain in "OPEN" position without first placing a burning match on the top of the burner.

Test fire the unit after referring to the SAFETY INFORMATION and LIGHTING INSTRUCTIONS.

If LP-Gas outdoor fire pits are used continuously after a couple of hours, you could see the possibility of the flame decreasing in size. If this happens, turn off the control valve and the tank valve and wait a couple of hours before lighting again or switch propane tanks. The propane tank is freezing up due to the volume of gas being taken out of the tank.

Gas Conversion for FP2085T and FP2785T Fire Pits

NOTE: CONVERSION SHOULD BE COMPLETED BEFORE FIRE PIT IS INSTALLED.

Caution- the gas supply shall be shut off before proceeding with the conversion.

- 1. Remove [2] screws from Orifice Retainer Bracket.
- 2. Remove Burner Orifice from Air Shutter. Using a 1/2" wrench, disconnect Burner Orifice from brass fitting and replace with supplied #15 NG Burner Orifice.
- 3. Set Air Shutter Adjustment to 1/4".
- 4. Re-insert new Burner Orifice into Air Shutter.
- Re-attach Orifice Retainer Bracket to Burner Tray.
- 6. Disconnect LP Hose and Regulator from Valve Assembly.

TO CONVERT PROPANE (MAP) SYSTEMS TO NATURAL GAS: TO CONVERT NATURAL GAS (MAN) SYSTEMS TO PROPANE:

- 1. Remove [2] screws from Orifice Retainer Bracket.
- 2. Remove Burner Orifice from Air Shutter. Using a 1/2" wrench, disconnect Burner Orifice from brass fitting and replace with supplied #38 LP Burner Orifice.
- 3. Set Air Shutter Adjustment Fully Open.
- 4. Re-insert new Burner Orifice into Air Shutter.
- 5. Re-attach Orifice Retainer Bracket to Burner Tray.
- 6. Connect LP Hose and Regulator to Valve Assembly.








BOTTOM VIEW

The Control Panel is inserted from the inside of the enclosure and set in place by tightening the [2] screws on the back of the Control Panel Assembly.



Product Maintenance For Your Canvas Fire Pit Cover

Caring for your Fire Pit Cover

The key to keeping your outdoor fabric looking great and extending its life is periodic cleaning followed by repellency treatment. Mildew can be a problem for any outdoor fabric. Mildew will not grow on a clean synthetic fabric. Combined with humidity, the dirt and debris, which accumulate on and in the fabric, create the ideal conditions for mildew propagation. Thus keeping outdoor fabric both clean and dry is essential to eliminate or minimize mildew growth.

- * Brush surfaces with soft brush to remove soil.
- * Soak with warm, soapy water (not to exceed 100 degrees Fahrenheit).
- * Use a mild soap such as Ivory, or Dawn. Do not use detergents, abrasives or cleaners.
- * Rinse fabric thoroughly after cleaning.
- * Let fabric air dry after rinsing
- * Do not machine dry.

Treating your Fabric

- * Before "retreating" or "protecting" a fabric, the fabric must be thoroughly cleaned. Fabric protector products bond most effectively to perfectly clean fabric. Anything not removed from the fabric will interfere with the bonding and performance of the product. All dirt, body oils, sweat, soap residue will impede bonding and performance.
- * Do not over spray. Saturation is not necessary. The surface needs to be slightly damp, but not soaked. Two lighter coats are better than one heavy coat. An even coating is more likely with two applications. Let the first coating dry to the touch before applying the second generally an hour.
- * The quicker you can get a fabric protector product to dry, the better bonding and performance you will achieve. It is best to treat the fabrics in warm weather, such as a hot day in full sun.
- * Maintenance is essential. You can lightly mist the surface every 6 months to check the water repellency. Friction will wear away product more quickly leaving the fabric unprotected. If this is the case, such areas can be spot treated to renew repellency.
- * Just a note Silicone water repellents are not true "fabric protectors". While they do develop good repellency, they often retain a tackiness that attracts dirt. Silicone treated fabrics soil much more rapidly than untreated fabrics, have no resistance to oil based stains, and can make fabrics more difficult to clean once soiled.

Stainless Steel Parts And Accessories

NOTE: The protective wrap on stainless steel parts is best removed at room temperature. A hair dryer may be helpful.

Cleaning Stainless Steel

Stainless steel tends to oxidize or stain in the presence of chlorides and sulfides, particularly in coastal areas and other harsh environments, such as the warm, highly humid atmosphere around pools and hot tubs. These stains could be perceived as rust, but can be easily removed or prevented. To provide stain prevention and removal, wash all stainless steel surfaces every 3-4 weeks or as often as required with fresh water and/or stainless steel cleaner.

Notes on Cleaning Stainless Steel Surfaces: Do not use abrasive cleaners or steel wool on any painted, or stainless steel parts. Doing so will scratch the finish. Exterior surfaces should be cleaned with warm soapy water. Use a stainless steel or a non-abrasive cleaner. Always wipe in the direction of the grain.

Over time, stainless steel parts discolor when heated, usually to a golden or brown hue. This discoloration is normal and does not affect the performance of the appliance.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Upon completing the gas line connection, a small amount of air will be in the lines. When first lighting the burner, it will take a few minutes for the lines to purge themselves of this air. Once the purging is complete, the burner will light and operate as indicated in the instruction manual. Subsequent lighting of the appliance will not require such purging.

WARNING: Read and follow the Safety and Lighting Instructions page in this manual and on labels on the appliance. IF YOU DO NOT FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS PRECISELY, A FIRE OR EXPLOSION MAY RESULT AND YOU MAY BE SERIOUSLY INJURED!

MAINTENANCE INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. The appliance should be inspected before initial use and inspected and cleaned at least annually by a qualified field service person.
- Tampering is **DANGEROUS** and voids all warranties.
 If the burner or any other component is found to be faulty, it must be replaced prior to operation of the appliance with an approved component. Replacement burner must be as specified in the manual.
- To obtain proper operation, it is imperative that the burner flame characteristics are steady, not lifting or floating. Check the burner flame patterns with Log Placement Instructions Section.
- 4. Periodically remove the logs and examine the burner. If dirty, clean with a soft brush. Also examine the area around the burner air shutter. Any dirt or lint in this area should be removed. This will ensure long life and trouble free operation. Re-install the logs as shown in the log placement instructions. When the appliance is put back in service, check the burner flame patterns with Log Placement Instructions Section.
- 5. Periodically check the hose connecting the LP-gas cylinder to ensure it is not damaged in any way.

HIGH ELEVATION INSTALLATION

U.L. Listed gas fireplaces are tested and approved for elevations from 0 to 4,500 feet in Canada and U.S.A.

When installing this fireplace at an elevation above 4,500 feet (in Canada), check with local authorities.

Consult your local gas utility for assistance in determining the proper orifice for your location.

CLEANING

It is recommended to annually inspect and clean the unit to prevent malfunction and / or sooting. This operation should be performed by your dealer or a qualified technician. Carefully remove media (log set, Rocks, Glass, etc.). Gloves are recommended.

Warning: Turn off Unit and allow to cool before cleaning. Only a qualified service technician should service and repair appliance.

- · Do not use cleaning fluids to clean logs.
- Use a soft bristle brush or a vacuum with brush attachment.
- Vacuum loose particles and dust from burner and valve
- Inspect Burner Plate, Pilot, Valve, and Mixing Sleeve for spider webs or other blockages.
- Replace media. Refer to the appropriate page in this manual for proper placement of contents, such as logs.

Safety Information and Manual Lighting Instructions

FOR YOUR SAFETY READ BEFORE LIGHTING

MARNING: If you do not follow these instructions exactly, a fire or explosion may result causing property damage, personal injury or loss of life.

- **A.** This appliance must be lit by hand. When lighting, follow these instructions exactly.
- **B.** Before LIGHTING, smell all around the appliance area for gas. Be sure to smell next to the floor, because some gas is heavier than air and will settle on the floor.
- C. Use only your hand to turn the gas control knob or valve. Never use tools. If the valve will not turn by hand, don't try to repair it, call a qualified service technician. Force or attempted repair may result in a fire or explosion.
- **D.** Do not use this appliance if any part has been underwater. Immediately call a qualified service technician to inspect the appliance, and to replace any part which has been underwater.
 - Immediately call your gas supplier from a neighbor's phone. Follow the gas supplier's instructions.
 - If you cannot reach your gas supplier, call the fire department.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU SMELL GAS

- Do not try to light any appliance.
- Do not touch any electric switch; do not use any phone in your building.

Manual Valve with Push Button Ignition

- 1. STOP! Read the safety information above.
- 2. Remove the top cover.
- 3. Find the manual gas control valve and push button igniter.
- 4. Turn ON gas supply.
- 5. Push and hold the button on the igniter and ensure sparking is occurring at the probes inside the burner tray.
- 6. Push in and turn the valve knob ON.
- 7. Gas should ignite within 10 seconds or less. If the burner does not light turn the gas to off.
- 8. Wait at least five (5) minutes to clear out any gas. Then smell for gas, including near the floor. If you smell gas, STOP!
- 9. If you don't smell gas, repeat step 4.

To Turn Off Gas Appliance

- Turn the on/off valve to the off position at the unit for natural gas unit. For LP unit, turn the on/off valve to the off position at the unit and then turn the valve on the LP tank to the off position clockwise.
- 2. Replace the top cover.


-FP2085/FP2785 Thermocouple Valve Systems-

NOTE: A Thermocouple has been added as a safety feature. This will shut off the manual gas valve if the flame is extinguished for any reason.

- The thermocouple must be engulfed by the flame in order to maintain proper operation. If the thermocouple is not surrounded by the flame, the burner will shut down.
- The thermocouple must have no more than a single layer of media (lava rock or glass) around it.

- FP2785T & FP2085T Thermocouple Equipped Fire Pits -**Lighting Instructions and Troubleshooting Guide**

To Light the Fire Pit:

Depress the valve knob with your hand (do not use tools or other devices that may cause damage). Turn the knob counterclockwise approximately 90° from the start point. Release the knob. If you can turn the knob further counterclockwise, but hit a stop which does not allow you to go back to the start point when turning

clockwise, you are in the correct position.



With the knob against the stop point, you are at the low flame height set point. Locate the igniter push button and depress it to begin the igniter sparking.



- 3. (a) Once the igniter is sparking, depress the gas valve knob to allow the flow of gas to begin. The flame should ignite within 2-15 seconds. If the flame ignites and remains present, skip ahead to step 4. If the flame does not ignite release the gas valve knob and igniter button and proceed to step 3(b).
 - (b) If you have depressed the igniter button and gas valve knob as above but the burner flame has not ignited after 15 seconds, immediately release the gas valve knob and igniter button and allow a sufficient

amount of time for the dissipation of gas from the area, as accumulated gas can be extremely dangerous and cause serious injury or even result in fatalities. It is recommended to allow 10-15 minutes of time to pass before attempting to light the appliance again. Longer periods may be required if the appliance is in an enclosed area blocking wind and air from circulating around it. It is recommended to use a fan in restricted areas to help clear the area of residual gas before attempting to relight the appliance. Natural gas is lighter than atmospheric air, and will tend to rise and collect in higher areas, while propane is heavier than atmospheric air, and will accumulate in lower areas.

(c) Once adequate time has passed and steps have been taken to dissipate any residual gas, inspect the igniter rod and thermocouple. Ensure that the media in the combustion area is not piled up and/or covering around the igniter and thermocouple locations. Both should be covered with a minimum of one layer of media, but still visible (see below).



Also ensure that the igniter rod has not become bent and that it is not touching the brass stud below it. There should be an approximately 1/4" to 3/8" gap between the igniter rod and the brass stud. If no spark is present, check to ensure that wiring is properly connected to the igniter rod and there are no cracks or exposed bare wire. Also change the battery in the igniter if necessary.

- (d) Repeat step 3(a). If flame fails to ignite, repeat steps 3(b), 3(c), and 3(d). However, it is recommended that you contact a qualified technician to properly and safely address the issue.
- **4.(a)** Once you have visually confirmed that the flame is present in the combustion area, continue to keep the gas valve knob depressed and allow the flame to heat the thermocouple. After approximately 15-30 seconds, slowly release the gas valve knob. Once fully released the flame should continue to be present and continue to run. If the flame is present, continue to step 5. If the flame goes out, go to step 3(b) and follow the steps from there back to the present point in the process.

(CONTINUED ON OTHER SIDE)

- **(b)** With the gas valve knob released and flame continuing to remain present in the combustion area, you can now select the flame height you would like for your enjoyment. If you turn the gas valve knob further counterclockwise until it stops, the appliance will be running at the maximum. Turning the valve control knob back (clockwise) until it reaches the Stop Point is the lowest setting. The flame can be modulated by setting the valve control knob anywhere between these two points. It may be necessary to select a higher setting due to windy conditions. This will be evident if the appliance flame is being blown sideways or if it is extinguished due to lack of flame contact with the thermocouple. Extremely windy conditions are not recommended for operation of the appliance, as flames are being blown out of the combustion area and can be very hazardous, causing personal or property damage. Also, if the flame is not allowed to burn properly in the designated combustion area, the thermocouple may not be properly or constantly heated and the appliance will continue to shut off repeatedly.
- 5. Once you are finished enjoying your appliance, turn the gas valve control knob clockwise until it stops (Stop Point / Lowest Flame Height). Once there, depress the gas valve control knob and continue to turn clockwise until it stops at the Start Point / Off Position and release. All flames should become extinguished. Finally, do not forget to turn off your gas supply for the appliance when you are not using it. This could be turning your propane tank off or locating your natural gas line shut-off and turning it to the closed position.
